What can I do?

1. Complete a Career Interest Inventory (like the [123 Career Test](#)) or use one you have already completed. What careers are a good match for you?
2. Is there a Career & Technical Education (CTE) program at your school or in your district for any of those careers?
3. If a CTE program is available, decide if you'd like to take the introduction class.
4. Ask your transition team to help you register for the course and support you to ensure that you receive the accommodations needed to do your best in the class.

Pro Tip!

Before you start your CTE class, meet with the instructor of the class to tell them about yourself. Share the results of your career interest survey that led you to sign up for the class, the accommodations you need to help you be successful, and anything else to help them get to know you as a learner!
